Hazrat Asma (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا)

حضرت اسماء (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا)

1. The Rasoolullah ﷺ and his close companion, Hazrat Abu Bakr Siddique (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) migrated from Makkah Mukarramah to Madinah Munawwarah in the year 622 A.D. When the chiefs of various tribes of Makkah Mukarramah came to know about the migration of the Rasoolullah ﷺ and his close companion, Hazrat Abu Bakr Siddique (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) they got **furios**. The chiefs were determined more than ever to find them out. They offered huge rewards and **bounties** for their capture, dead or alive.

2. The preparation for this journey was made at the house of Hazrat Abu Bakr Siddique (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ). Hazrat Asma (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) rendered useful services in this regard. She prepared food for this journey. She tied the food on the camel's back with her own belt as nothing else could be found. For this service she was given the title of Zaat-un-Nitaqain by the Rasoolullah ﷺ.

3. During the **perilous** journey, it was very difficult for anyone to supply food to Hazrat Muhammad ﷺ. The situation was so delicate that the slightest mistake could have endangered the life of the Rasoolullah ﷺ. This grand task was nicely undertaken by Hazrat Asma (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا), the daughter of Hazrat Abu Bakr Siddique (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ). Every night, with the pack of food, she ventured quietly towards the rugged mountains where the cave of Thawr was located. She took care of the minute

2- اس سفر کی تیاری حضرت ابو بکر صدیق (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) کے گھر ہوئی۔ حضرت اسماء (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) نے اس سلسلہ میں مفید خدمات سر انجام دیں۔ آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) نے اس سفر کیلئے کھانا تیار کیا۔ آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) نے اپنی کمر بند سے کھانے کو اونٹ کی پشت پر باندھ دیا۔ کیونکہ اور کچھ نہ ملا تھا۔ اس خدمت کی بناء پر رسول اللہ ﷺ کی طرف سے آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) کو ذات النطاقین کا لقب دیا گیا۔

3- اس پر خطر سفر کے دوران، کسی کیلئے بھی رسول اللہ ﷺ کو کھانا پہنچانا بہت مشکل کام تھا۔ یہ اتنا حساس کام تھا کہ ذرا سی بھی غلطی حضور ﷺ کی زندگی کو خطرے میں ڈال سکتی تھی۔ حضرت ابو بکر صدیق (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) کی بیٹی حضرت اسماء (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) نے بڑی عمدگی سے اس عظیم کام کو نبھایا۔ ہر رات کھانے کی گٹھڑی کے ساتھ آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) خاموشی سے مہماتی سفر کر کے ان دشوار گزار پہاڑوں کی طرف جاتیں جہاں غار ثور واقع تھا۔ اس کام کی تکمیل میں آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) نے

details in accomplishing the task. How difficult it must have been for her to traverse the rocky path at night, with the constant fear of being **detected** and caught!

4. On the night of the migration, a tribal chief of the disbelievers, Abu Jehl, in a fit of fury headed towards Hazrat Abu Bakr Siddique's (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) home. He began to knock at the door violently. Addressing Hazrat Asma, he demanded, "Where is your father?" She politely replied, "How would I know?" This response shows the wisdom and courage of Hazrat Asma (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا). She didn't make any statement that would give him even a minor clue. She simply posed a counter question that **infuriated** Abu Jehl. He slapped Hazrat Asma's (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) face so hard that her ear-ring fell off but she remained steadfast and did not **reveal** the secret.

5. Her grandfather, Hazrat Abu Quhafoo (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) was a disbeliever at that time. He was very old and also blind. He said to her, "Asma, I think Abu Bakr has taken all the wealth, leaving you and children empty-handed and helpless." At this, she instantly ran to a corner of the home. She gathered some pebbles and put them at the place where her father used to keep his money and jewels. She covered it with a piece of cloth. "Come grandfather, look! he has left all this for us." He touched the cloth and thought it was full of gold and jewels. His concern was **alleviated** and he felt relieved to know that Abu Bakr Siddique (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) had left all his wealth at home.

4۔ ہجرت کی رات، کافروں کے ایک قبیلے کا سردار، ابو جہل انتہائی غصے کی حالت میں حضرت ابو بکر صدیق (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) کے گھر کی طرف روانہ ہوا۔ اس نے دروازے کو زور سے کھٹکھٹانا شروع کر دیا۔ حضرت اسماء (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) سے مخاطب ہو کر اس سے پوچھا "تمہارے ابو کہاں ہیں؟" آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) نے شائستگی سے جواب دیا "میں کیسے جان سکتی ہوں؟" یہ جواب حضرت اسماء (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) کی دانشمندی اور ہمت کو ظاہر کرتا ہے۔ آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) نے کوئی ایسی بات نہ کی جس سے اُس کو کوئی چھوٹا سا بھی اشارہ ملتا۔ آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) نے محض جواباً ایک سوال داغ ڈالا جس سے ابو جہل طیش میں آگیا۔ اس نے حضرت اسماء (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) کے چہرے پر اتنی زور سے تھپڑ مارا کہ آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) کے کانوں کی بالی گر گئی لیکن آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) ثابت قدم رہیں اور راز فاش نہ کیا۔

5۔ آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) کے دادا ابو حضرت ابو قحافہ اس وقت ایک غیر مسلم تھے۔ وہ بہت بوڑھے اور نابینا تھے۔ انہوں نے آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) سے کہا "اسماء (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا)، میرا خیال ہے کہ ابو بکر (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) تمہیں اور بچوں کو خالی ہاتھ اور بے یار و مددگار چھوڑ کر تمام دولت لے گیا ہے۔ اس پر وہ فوراً بھاگتی ہوئی گھر کے ایک کونے کی طرف گئیں۔ آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) نے کچھ کنکریاں اکٹھی کیں اور ان کو اس جگہ پر رکھ دیا جہاں آپ کے ابو اپنی دولت اور جواہرات رکھا کرتے تھے۔ آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) نے اسے ایک کپڑے کے ساتھ ڈھانپ دیا۔ "آئیں دادا ابو، دیکھیں! وہ یہ سب ہمارے لئے چھوڑ گئے ہیں۔" انہوں نے کپڑے کو اٹھوڑا اور سوچا کہ یہ سونے اور جواہرات سے بھرا ہوا ہے۔ ان کی تشویش کم ہوئی اور انہیں یہ جان کر تسلی ہوئی کہ ابو بکر صدیق (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) اپنی تمام دولت گھر چھوڑ گئے تھے۔

6. Hazrat Asma (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) was amongst the early few ones who had accepted Islam. She was the daughter of Hazrat Abu Bakr Siddique (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) and the stepsister of Hazrat Ayesha Siddiqua (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا). She was Hazrat Zubair bin al-Awwam's (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) wife and the mother of Hazrat Abdullah bin Zubair (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ). She died at the old age of about a hundred years. Hazrat Abdullah bin Zubair (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہ) used to say that he had not seen anybody more generous and open hearted than his aunt Hazrat Ayesha and his mother. Hazrat Asma (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) was so generous that she sold her inherited garden and gave away all the money to the poor and the needy. Nobody ever returned empty-handed from her doorstep.

7. Hazrat Asma (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) will always be remembered for her courage, generosity and wisdom. She had **resolute** faith in Allah (سُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَى). Her life would always be a **beacon** of light for all of us.

7- حضرت اسماء (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) کو اپنی ہمت، سخاوت اور دانشمندی کی وجہ سے ہمیشہ یاد رکھا جائے گا۔ آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) اللہ قادر مطلق پر پختہ ایمان رکھتی تھیں۔ آپ (رضی اللہ تعالیٰ عنہا) کی زندگی ہم سب کے لئے ہمیشہ مشعل راہ رہے گی۔
